Our presence and discussion about the Spanish involvement in the American Revolution has been well received by the Spanish descendants and some are asking to join us. In New Mexico, if nowhere else in the country, the Spanish support should be noted and their efforts discussed in our schools and in our outreach to the general population. Others are noting that we exist and are active and want to join us. I believe we have begun a process and it should continue to help us grow in membership and in general acceptance.

Obituaries


